"As Republicans our first concern is for those waiting tonight to begin or resume the climb up life's ladder. We do not accept that ours will ever be a nation of haves and have nots; we must always be a nation of haves and soon to haves."

"The extremism that stifles the development of homegrown energy, or cancels a perfectly safe pipeline that would employ tens of thousands, or jacks up consumer utility bills for no improvement in either human health or world temperature, is a pro-poverty policy. It must be replaced by a passionate pro-growth approach that breaks all ties and calls all close ones in favor of private sector jobs that restore opportunity for all and generate the public revenues to pay our bills.

"That means a dramatically simpler tax system of fewer loopholes and lower rates. A pause in the mindless piling on of expensive new regulations that devour dollars that otherwise could be used to hire somebody. It means maximizing on the new domestic energy technologies that are the best break our economy has gotten in years."

"It's not fair and it's not true for the President to attack Republicans in Congress as obstacles on these questions. February Speaker Scott Baugh

Scott Randall Baugh is a Republican U.S. politician, who served in the California State Assembly from 1995–2000, representing the 67th District in coastal Orange County.

Baugh earned his Bachelor of Science in Business Administration in 1984 at Liberty University, graduating Summa Cum Laude. He then earned his Juris Doctor in 1987 at the University of the Pacific, McGeorge School of Law.

He was elected to the Assembly upon the recall of Assembly Speaker Doris Allen. Baugh served as the Assembly Republican Leader from 1999 until 2000. In 2004, he was elected Chairman of the Republican Party of Orange County

In March 2007, former Massachusetts Gov. Mitt Romney, seeking the GOP nod for president in 2008, announced that Scott Baugh would serve as a member of his California statewide finance committee.

Scott Baugh will talk on the State of the GOP and will answer questions about the party at the local and state level.

President's Message

Mitt Romney or Newt Gingrich?

Our club doesn't endorse candidates, and the race for the Republican presidential nomination isn't over yet, but it looks more and more like it will be a two-man contest, even as Rick Santorum and Ron Paul pledge to campaign on.

Gingrich's victory in the South Carolina primary, a resounding surprise, bolstered his chances, especially when you consider that Romney held a double-digit lead a week prior to the vote. Many conservatives were disappointed by Gingrich's debate attacks on Romney as an unethical capitalist, an argument one would expect to be made by those on the other side of the aisle. Romney also stumbled on questions about releasing his tax returns.

South Carolina results aside, Romney's overall numbers throughout the bruising primary season haven't improved much, a clear indication that he is failing to attract conservatives to his brand of Republicanism. On the other hand, he continues to poll strongly with independents, the block of voters most predict will decide the general election in November. We'll learn more in the Florida primary, which will occur after we go to press with this issue of our newsletter.

So will our party nominate Romney or Gingrich?

I don't know about you, but I find myself somewhat dismayed with our apparent choice. Some good conservative candidates have fallen by the wayside in recent months, undone by a lack of familiarity with key issues, potential personal scandals, and certain positions met with derision by the Republican electorate.

Maybe you feel the way I do, that we're being given a less-than-ideal choice between candidates with strong positives and well-documented negatives that engender continuing uncertainty among knowledgeable voters.

Here's the thing: in all likelihood, Romney or Gingrich will be the Republican nominee. At that point, I will forget my misgivings and lend our candidate my unconditional support. I hope you will too. In the general election, the alternative is not an option!

Americanism

Three of our finest presidents were born in February! They speak for us, the American spirit, on liberty vs slavery.

President George Washington February 22

General Command Headquarters, New York, July 2, 1776

"The time is now near at hand which must probably determine whether Americans are to be freemen or slaves; whether they are to have any property they can call their own; whether their houses and farms are to be pillaged and destroyed, and themselves consigned to a state of wretchedness.... The fate of unborn millions will now depend, under God, on the courage of this army...."

President Abraham Lincoln February 12

Commander in Chief to the Indiana Regiment, March 17, 1865

"Whenever I hear anyone arguing for slavery, I feel a strong impulse to see it tried on him personally."

President Ronald Wilson Reagan February 6

Remarks at the Annual Captive Nations Week, July 19, 1983

"Two visions of the world remain locked in dispute. The first believes all men are created equal by a loving God who has blessed us with freedom. Abraham Lincoln spoke for us: 'No man,' he said, 'is good enough to govern another without the other's consent.' The second vision believes that religion is opium for the masses. It believes that eternal principles like truth, liberty, and democracy have no meaning beyond the whim of the state. And Lenin spoke for them: 'It is true, that liberty is precious,' he said, 'so precious that it must be rationed.' Well, I'll take Lincoln's version over Lenin's — and so will the world if they're given the choice."



Save the Bill of Rights

The sixth amendment says:

In all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right to a speedy and public trial, by an impartial jury of the State and district wherein the crime shall have been committed, which district shall have been previously ascertained by law, and to be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation; to be confronted with the witnesses against him; to have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his favor, and to have the Assistance of Counsel for his defence.

Most people associate the Sixth Amendment with a defendant's rights. Yet, as author Frank Minter reveals in *Saving the Bill of Rights*, the sixth amendment protects jurors' rights too.

Under the sixth amendment, jurors have the right to acquit someone if they think a law is unjust or that the law has been applied unfairly. This is called jury nullification.

Many jurors don't know about jury nullification though because judges routinely instruct jurors that they're not supposed to determine a law's justness, only whether a defendant broke that law.

However, that instruction undermines one of a jury's key roles, because our founders thought that it was important for juries to not only judge the evidence in question, but the law as well. In fact, John Jay, the first chief justice of the Supreme Court said, "The jury has the right to judge both the law as well as the fact in controversy."

Yet today, judges don't hold Jay's opinion and routinely violate jurors' rights, the defendant's rights, and ultimately the Sixth Amendment by not telling jurors about jury nullification.

It's (not) the economy, stupid

What happens if the economy gets better?

If you are a Republican candidate, who has built a campaign around being a better manager of the economy, a better economy (without the benefit of your management) would spell the end of your campaign.

We can see this happening now.

A small downtick in the jobless rate from a catastrophic 9% to a slightly less catastrophic 8.5% has spurred an obedient media to declare that the economy has turned a corner, thanks to the management of the Obama administration, and to change horses now would put America's economic recovery at risk.

Of course none of this is true. But none of this will matter if the Republican nominee runs a campaign solely on which candidate will better manage the economy.

The 2012 election is not about the economy. It is a battle for the heart and soul of America. The idea of America. The American philosophy.

Barack Obama is a philosophical warrior. He set the philosophical stage for his re-election campaign in Osawatimie, Kansas on December 6, 2011. In that one speech, he invoked the theme of 'fairness' fifteen times.

As I have written before, a non-thinking urge for fairness lies dormant within all children, and becomes dominant within those who fail to grow up. Case in point: the Occupy Wall Street Movement, whose sole unifying idea is that it's "not fair" that some people have more than others. That worldview resonated with Barack Obama, who said to them in November, "You are the reason I ran for office."

A child with one toy will look at another child with three toys and cry to his mommy, "It's not fair!" A bully child will forcibly take one toy from the other child to restore "fairness." But a truly bad child will demonize the other child for having three toys, whip up the playground into a jealous frenzy, and march on the "unfair" child to take away all of his toys.

If it's childish when a child does it, then what is it when the leader of the free world does it?

The President is not a child. Therefore, I believe his internal polling shows that he can stoke the childlike instincts of a plurality of voters, and get re-elected under the banner of "fairness."

We used to have something called "The American Dream." It was the belief that America was the land of opportunity. The

place where the world's huddled masses could come to make better lives for themselves. The land where anyone could grow up to be President.

This desire to be #1 is deeply ingrained in the American character. If being #1 means having more toys — congratulations — you have achieved the American Dream. And your "unfair" allotment of toys (or cars or cash or corporations) will stand as a beacon in this land of opportunity: an inspiration for others to use their blessings of liberty to pursue the American Dream.

They might even open a toy store.

In the late 1970's, America suffered under a president who sought fairness over freedom and equality over the American Dream. In his now-infamous "Crisis of Confidence" speech in 1979, President Carter said, "Our nation must be fair.... I will lead our fight, and I will enforce fairness in our struggle."

Carter's philosophy was defeated by Ronald Reagan's philosophy, which he articulated when he launched his campaign: "I cannot and will not stand by and see this great country destroy itself. Our leaders attempt to blame their failures on circumstances beyond their control, on false estimates by unknown, unidentifiable experts who rewrite modern history in an attempt to convince us our high standard of living, the result of thrift and hard work, is somehow selfish extravagance which we must renounce as we join in sharing scarcity. I don't agree that our nation must resign itself to inevitable decline, yielding its proud position to other hands."

The philosophical heir to Jimmy Carter is in the White House now. It took a philosopher to beat Jimmy Carter. And it will take a philosopher to beat Barack Obama.

It's not the economy, stupid. It's the philosophy.
